

# SHEET 07 : SECURITY PRECAUTIONS OUTSIDE CSG (1/3)

Issue : 0.0

Outside of CSG, precautions must be taken by all personnel to avoid ending up in dangerous situation. They are described here under.

They must be explained by the company hierarchy to each staff member before their departure to French Guiana.

A dedicated downtown security briefing will be made by ARIANESPACE as soon as possible after arrival in French Guiana.

All personnel must have the card with the emergency numbers upon arrival in French Guiana (see [Appendix 06](#)).



## **Security precautions outside CSG:**

### **1. Context**

In order to your stay will go as well as possible and you will enjoy this beautiful French overseas department, where the French law applies without restrictions, precautions of good sense are to be taken.

These precautions are similar to those required in most major cities.

Generally speaking, the gendarmerie recommends to all residents or missionary personnel in Guiana to behave "as a good father or a good mother." This means avoiding situations of insecurity such as alcohol abuse, going out until the early morning, contact with unknown persons, attendance at unknown places, etc.

## 2. Your travels in the city

During the day, do not walk in neighborhoods that you don't know and preferably go in group.

At night, take your vehicle, with several passengers if possible. Park it in an well-lit place, close to your destination. Walk only between the vehicle and your destination (the restaurant, the bar, the hotel, ...).

Don't go to the beach at night.

Sometimes, groups of people on bikes or scooters can show aggressive behavior. Try to avoid these groups. In case you are attacked or bothered, stay calm and call for help (see Appendix 06).

Leave the originals of your papers at the hotel, make photocopies and take them with you (tolerated by the authorities in French Guiana).

Don't take money from ATMs at night.

## 3. Don't unnecessarily attract attention, be discrete.

Don't wear ostentatious jewelry, don't show your smartphone, your credit cards or your money in the streets.

## 4. Hitchhikers

Never stop to take hitchhikers in French Guiana.

## 5. Your vehicle

Do not leave anything visible in your car. Do not leave anything valuable in the vehicle.

Remove the CSG vehicle badge when outside the CSG.

Drive with closed windows and the doors locked ... with air conditioning!

## 6. In case of assault

Never resist. Give what you are asked to give. Try to remember your attackers (special signs, clothes, tattoos, etc.)

## 7. Emergency situations

All emergency numbers are given in Appendix 06.

In the event of an emergency situation outside of the CSG, personnel must :

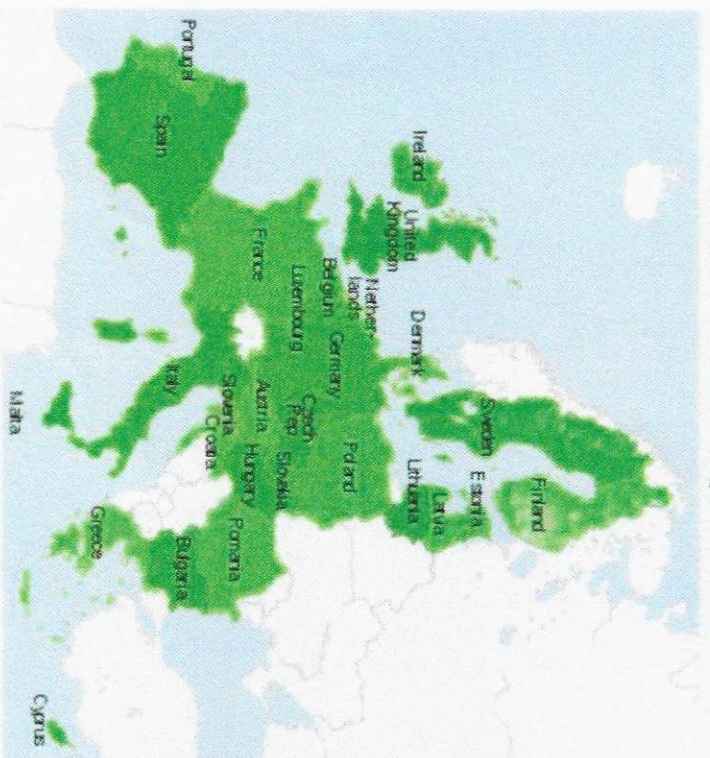
- 1) prioritize emergency contact - 15 for the SAMU (ambulance), 17 for the Police
- 2) then a member of FLS in case of difficulty with the help and in all cases to inform FLS of the problem and the issue
- 3) then, the staff must inform their management

# SHEET 08 : DRIVING IN FRENCH GUIANA

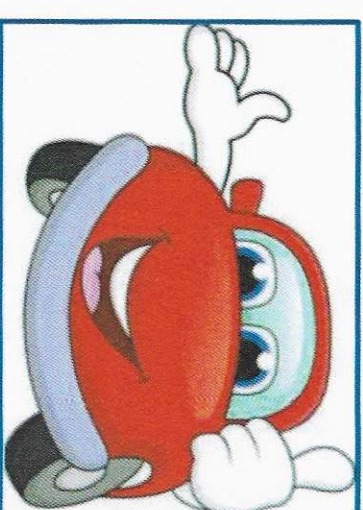

The national driving license is valid in French Guiana for nationals of the European Union :

Member states of the European Union



Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Rep., Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, United Kingdom



The international driving license is necessary for all the others.

The rules are the same as in metropolitan France :

- 50 km/h (31 miles/h) in town
- Outside the town, the maximum speed is 80 km/h (49 miles/h)
- the alcohol limit allowed is 0.5 g alcohol per liter of blood (blood test) or 0.25 mg alcohol per liter of exhaled air (breath test).
